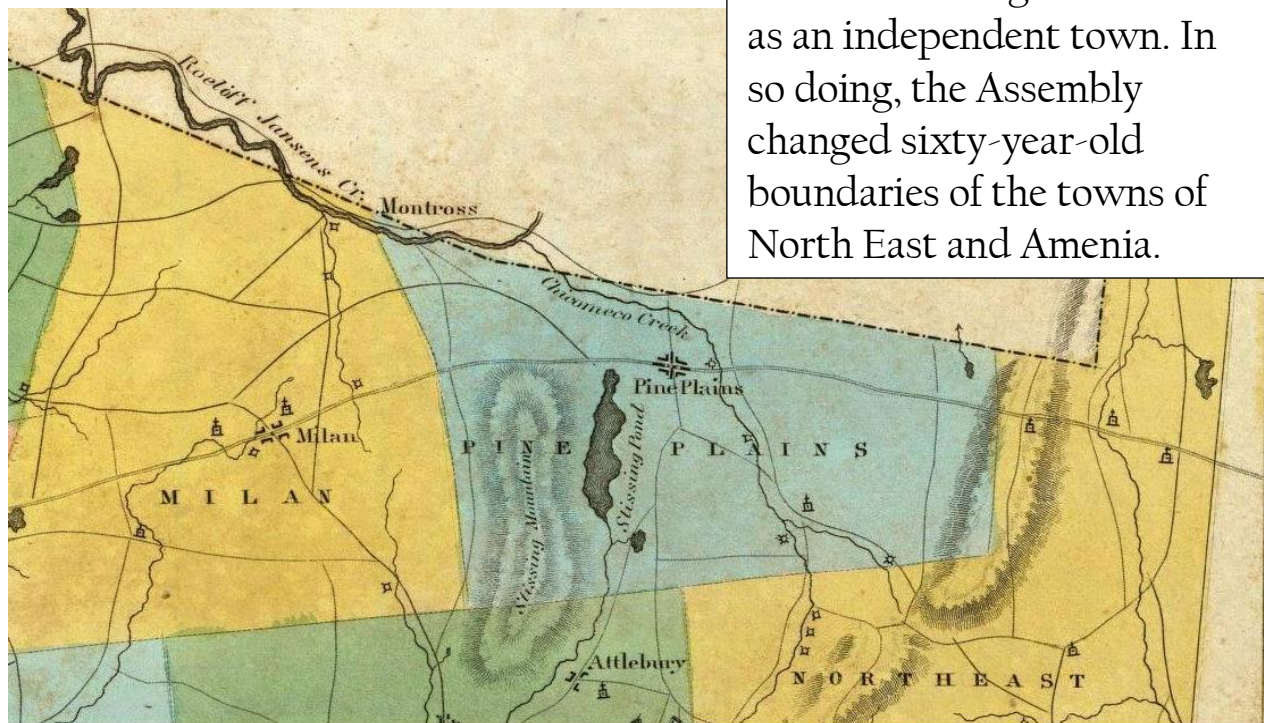

On March 26, 1823, the New York State Assembly passed a law establishing Pine Plains as an independent town. In so doing, the Assembly changed sixty-year-old boundaries of the towns of North East and Amenia.



Why did the creation of Pine Plains have such a significant impact on the municipal landscape of Dutchess County? And what do these changes tell us about the development of Northern Dutchess since the mid-18th century?
